



Memorandum of Understanding on Exchange and Cooperation

between

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the New South Wales Government

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the New South Wales Government, endeavouring to deepen the cooperative and mutually beneficial relationship built since entering into a sister state agreement on 9 May 1984, have reached the following understanding to engage in close exchange and cooperation in the following areas of common interest:

- (1) Clean energy transition, including hydrogen
- (2) Education
- (3) Sports
- (4) Sustainable city planning and liveability

Both states, designating the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Office of the Governor for Policy Planning, International Affairs Division and the New South Wales Government Cabinet Office as the departments responsible for facilitating execution of the MoU, shall endeavour to steadily promote the creation of programs for exchange and cooperation in the areas agreed upon.

The responsible administrations shall provide support to the departments in charge of implementing policies in each of the areas covered by the MoU.

With the desire to bring the current friendly and cooperative relationship that exists between the two states to an even closer level, both states shall conduct regular reciprocal visits and discussions.

Besides, the two states shall exchange officers as necessary.

Signed in Sydney on 6 February 2024, this MoU has been made in duplicate in both Japanese and English, both equally authentic. Both states shall hold one copy of each text.
