Ensuring a "Future Tokyo" filled with hope for future generations

In March 2021, we formulated "Future Tokyo: Tokyo's Long-Term Strategy," our vision for the ideal future. And, last February, we updated this vision to reflect various changes that have been brought about by the Tokyo 2020 Games and battle against COVID-19 to formulate "Future Tokyo: Tokyo's Long-Term Strategy Version Up 2022."

Since the formulation of the updated vision, however, the global situation continues to change at a dizzying pace, affected by developments including the prolonged COVID-19 pandemic, natural disasters caused by extreme weather, and issues related to national security, energy security, and food security brought on by events such as Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Turning to the situation in Japan, we are also facing layer upon layer of difficulties, including abrupt exchange rate fluctuations, higher costs due to the rising price of raw materials, a tight energy supply-demand balance, and estimates indicating that the number of annual births in the country will fall below 800,000.



Amid such great upheaval, we are now called upon to effect change. Precisely because we are in a challenging situation, we must share various types of wisdom, without being bound by precedent. Through this process, new industries, new jobs, and new convenience will be created. We must seize upon opportunities such as this one, and make the proper adjustments to our strategy to realize a bright future Tokyo. Now we are standing at such a pivotal moment.

As Goto Shinpei, the seventh mayor of Tokyo, once advocated, it is the people who will lead the way. We will work to make Tokyo a city that enhances the power of the people, draws out the power of the people, and where each person takes on a leading role.

First, we will work to ensure safety and security, which form the foundation for the city's activities, and solidify the base for Tokyo's growth. In addition, we will advance "investment in the future" with a sense of speed to realize a Tokyo where each and every individual can achieve self-fulfillment. This includes urgent measures to address the declining birthrate, measures for the development of human resources which power growth, measures related to startups and changes in the industrial structure, and measures for striking a balance between achieving carbon neutrality and maintaining economic growth through the utilization of Green Transformation (GX) and Digital Transformation (DX).

When Tokyo changes, the future changes as well. As we now stand at this turning point in history, let's work together to cultivate these new beginnings, and pass down a "Future Tokyo" filled with hope to generations to come.

1 Significance of the Formulation

- In March 2021, we formulated "Future Tokyo: Tokyo's Long-Term Strategy."
- This Future Strategy sets being resilient to changing times and circumstances, i.e., "Agile," as its basic strategy, and will be revised as initiatives progress and the social environment changes.
- In February 2022, based on this basic strategy, we formulated "Future Tokyo: Tokyo's Long-Term Strategy Version Up 2022," taking into account the changes and transformations that have been brought about by the Tokyo 2020 Games and COVID-19.
- However, even after the upgrade, the need to respond proactively to the emergence of global issues where conventional practices is no longer applicable, and to the rapid decline in birthrates has led to the decision to upgrade this time.

2 Position

The following items are summarized in order to realize the "Visions" for Tokyo in the 2040s set forth in "Future Tokyo: Tokyo's Long-Term Strategy".

- Establish new policies and review existing policies based on the recent changes and transformations in social conditions
- Update the three year action plan through the PDCA (Plan-Do-Check-Action) cycle




The world and Japan are in the midst of an upheaval caused by unprecedented crises such as infectious diseases, climate crises, and disputes

- COVID-19, a global pandemic since 2019, is reaching a turning point with efforts by humanity, including the development of a vaccine
 - 7 The protracted situation in Ukraine has led to an international competition for resources, and the world is undergoing a structural shift toward decarbonization and energy security
 - With the climate crisis still in the offing, new targets for further reductions in greenhouse gas emissions to achieve the "1.5°C target" set in the Paris Agreement at COP27, the world is accelerating its move toward decarbonization
 - Looking at Japan, there are long-term absolute shortages of human resources due to the declining birthrate and aging population, rapid exchange rate fluctuations, and declining international competitiveness

Upgrade policies based on changes and transformations

Tokyo's future population will peak in 2030 (14.24 million) and will gradually decline after that Population in Jag

- Tokyo's population in 2021 began to decline for the first time in 26 years as a result of COVID-19, which caused people to move out of Tokyo, foreign nationals to return to their countries, and the number of births to decrease
- Population is gradually recovering after spring 2022 due to recovery of socio-economic activities and easing of immigration restrictions
- According to objective demographic estimates based on the results of the 2020 census, Tokyo's total population will **peak in** 2030, five years later than the previous estimates
- By area, the population of Special ward area will peak in 2035 (9.99 million) and that of Tama Area and Tokyo islands in 2025 (4.35 million), followed by a gradual decline after that






