Governor Koike speaks at the SOUTHEAST ASIA DEVELOPMENT SYMPOSIUM 2022 (SEADS2022) held March 16-17

Governor Koike became the first city leader to participate in SEADS2022 as a keynote speaker. The symposium, organized by the Asian Development Bank (ADB), was held March 16-17. In her address, the governor spoke of Tokyo's initiatives for a sustainable recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. To view the governor's speech, please click <u>here</u>.

Main highlights

- Tokyo is promoting a range of policies under the keywords: "green," "digital," and "inclusive."
- The Tokyo Metropolitan Government plans to issue 40 billion yen in Tokyo Green Bonds in fiscal 2022.
- Tokyo plans to build a digital twin for the entire city by 2030. This will make it possible for us to visualize congestion and take more sophisticated measures in times of emergency.
- In fiscal 2022, Tokyo will establish a Partnership Oath System, which will grant certification to sexual minorities as publicly recognized couples.

- ・性的マイノリティのカップルが互いに人生のパートナーであることを宣誓したことを証明する「パートナーシップ宣誓制度」を、2022 年度に創設します。
